## Red Oak ISD Meal Charge Regulation

## Meal Charges – State Law

As established by Board Policy CO(LOCAL), a student with an exhausted or insufficient balance on their meal account shall be allowed to continue to purchase meals for up to a total of \$25. The Superintendent has developed administrative regulations for this grace period to address:

- 1. The District's processes for parent notification during the grace period, including a schedule for repayment:
  - a. Students will be given a low balance notice when they have any negative balance.
  - b. The parent/guardian will be contacted via phone and email when their account negative balance reaches \$10.
  - c. When a student exceeds the maximum charge limit of \$25, the parent/guardian will be contacted via letter, phone and email. A student will receive a courtesy meal when they exceed the charge limit.
  - d. Parent/guardian may contact Student Nutrition Services at 972-617-2941, to set up a schedule of repayment. Red Oak ISD will accept payments as low as \$10 per week in addition to any new charges.
- 2. To minimize overt identification of the student, students will not be limited to certain foods or beverages during the grace period.
- 3. No fees or interest shall be charged by the District for meals purchased during the grace period.

# **Meal Charges – Federal Law**

For each campus that participates in the federal school breakfast or lunch programs under which students may incur a meal charge, the District's administrative regulations shall also address procedures for a student who has insufficient funds to purchase a meal following exhaustion of the grace period described above. The procedures shall address:

- 1. The parameters under which reimbursable or courtesy meals shall be served to the student:
  - a. All students attending an elementary or middle school that are not qualified for free or reduced price meals and have reached their negative (-\$25) account limit will be offered a courtesy meal at lunch. There is no courtesy meal at breakfast.

- b. All students attending a high school who are not qualified for free or reduced price meals and have reached their (-\$25) account limit will need to use cash to purchase any food in the cafeteria. They will need to request a courtesy meal from the cafeteria manager or campus designee.
- 2. The District's efforts to minimize overt identification of the student are as follows:
  - a. The parent/guardian will be contacted via letter, phone and email.
  - b. A school administrator will contact the household regarding their child's account balance via letter, phone and email.
- 3. How the District will attempt to collect unpaid debt in order to maintain the financial integrity of the food service account is as follows:
  - a. The parent/guardian will be contacted via letter, phone and email.
  - b. Red Oak ISD has a repayment plan to help parents with unpaid debt.

Elementary and Middle School: Once a student reaches the (-\$25) account limit, the student will receive a courtesy meal which consists of the entree of the day, a serving of fruit or vegetable, and a carton of plain low-fat milk. The district is charged \$1.60 for these meals.

High School: Once a student reaches the (-\$25) account limit, the student will receive a courtesy meal which consists of a sunbutter sandwich, a serving of fruit or vegetable, and a carton of plain low-fat milk. The district is charged \$1.60 for these meals.

It is a goal of the District that no child goes without a meal. We will work with families to ensure they are receiving all meal benefits for which they are eligible.
