• **Mobility** Lines have been added that indicate the mobility rate by race/ethnicity.

•**Staff Information** Lines have been added that indicate the average years of experience of campus leadership.




Comparison Charts




STAAR Percent Met Standard (Approaches) All Grades, <u>Reading</u>


STAAR Percent Met Standard (Approaches) All Grades, <u>Math</u>




STAAR Percent Met Standard (Approaches) All Grades, <u>Science</u>



STAAR Percent Met Standard (Approaches) All Grades, <u>Social Studies</u>






STAAR Percent Met or Exceeded Progress (Meets) All Grades, Mathematics




STAAR Percent Exceeded Progress (Masters) All Grades, Mathematics


