- 1. Work for yourself.
  - Make phone calls.
  - Fill out on-line questionnaires.
  - Make a HUDL highlight video of your senior season.
- 2. Your high school coach will not be able to get you a scholarship, your talent as a student/athlete will.
- Coaches will be honest and fair with you about college recruiting. They want you to succeed.
- Highlights are great but, game footage is very important in the recruiting process.
- 5. Make sure you choose a college entrance exam (ACT or SAT), stick with the same exam, and take it at least two or more times.
- You will need to sign a transcript release form in the counselor's office so colleges can access your unofficial transcript.
- 7. Colleges can only call at specific times during the year.
- 8. As a junior, you will be able to receive calls until May of this year.
- 9. Try to see as many schools as you can and become familiar with the different requirements for each.

- 10.Be selective about camps during the summer.
  - One-day camps are usually the best.
  - Camps with multiple colleges at them are all good.
- 11. College coaches cannot attend combines.
- 12. Speed and strength are important, but you will still have to prove what you can do on the field.
- 13. Your senior year is *critical* in the recruiting process.
- 14. Be polite and talk with all schools. You never know what is going to happen.
- 15. Colleges fill up with commitments.

  Make sure you understand this.
- 16. Make sure you understand the definition of "commitment".
- 17. Ask questions about the recruiting process. *Be thorough in your search.*
- 18. Understand that college coaches are filling a need also.
- 19. Recruiting services cost money that you can save by working for yourself.
