# **Physical warning signs of drug abuse**

Bloodshot eyes, pupils larger or smaller than usual

Changes in appetite or sleep patterns.  
Sudden weight loss or weight gain

Deterioration of physical appearance,  
personal grooming habits

Unusual smells on breath, body, or  
clothing

Tremors, slurred speech, or impaired  
coordination



# Behavioral signs of drug abuse



Drop in attendance and performance at work or school



Unexplained need for money or financial problems. May borrow or steal to get it.



Engaging in secretive or suspicious behaviors



Sudden change in friends, favorite hangouts, and hobbies



Frequently getting into trouble (fights, accidents, illegal activities)

Unexplained change in personality or attitude

Sudden mood swings, irritability, or angry outbursts

Periods of unusual hyperactivity, agitation, or giddiness

Lack of motivation; appears lethargic or “spaced out”

Appears fearful, anxious, or paranoid, with no reason

## **Psychological warning signs of drug abuse**

# Warning signs of teen drug abuse



Having bloodshot eyes or dilated pupils; using eye drops to try to mask these signs



Skipping class; declining grades; suddenly getting into trouble at school



Missing money, valuables, or prescriptions



Acting uncharacteristically isolated, withdrawn, angry, or depressed



Dropping one group of friends for another; being secretive about the new peer group



Loss of interest in old hobbies; lying about new interests and activities



Demanding more privacy; locking doors; avoiding eye contact; sneaking around

# When your teen has a problem: Steps parents can take

## Lay down rules & consequences



Your teen should understand that using drugs comes with specific consequences. But don't make hollow threats or set rules that you cannot enforce. Make sure your spouse and/ co-parent agrees with the rules and is prepared to enforce them.



## Monitor your teen's activity

Know where your teen goes and who he or she hangs out with. It's also important to routinely check potential hiding places for drugs as well as cell phone and app activity. Explain to your teen that this lack of privacy is a consequence of him or her having been caught using drugs.

# When your teen has a problem: Steps parents can take

**Encourage other interests & social activities.**



Expose your teen to healthy hobbies and activities, such as team sports and afterschool clubs.



**Talk to your child about underlying issues.**

Drug use can be the result of other problems. Is your child having trouble fitting in? Has there been a recent major change which is causing stress? Is he or she struggling with a mental health challenge?

# When your teen has a problem: Steps parents can take

## Get Help



Teenagers don't always believe what their parents say but, if they hear the same information from a different person, they may be more inclined to listen. Try a coach, family doctor, therapist, or counselor.





# *What is a Vape?*

A vape, originally called an electronic cigarette, is an electronic device that contains a chamber or cartridge that holds fluids that generally contain flavoring and a substance such as nicotine, THC, CBD or Delta 8.

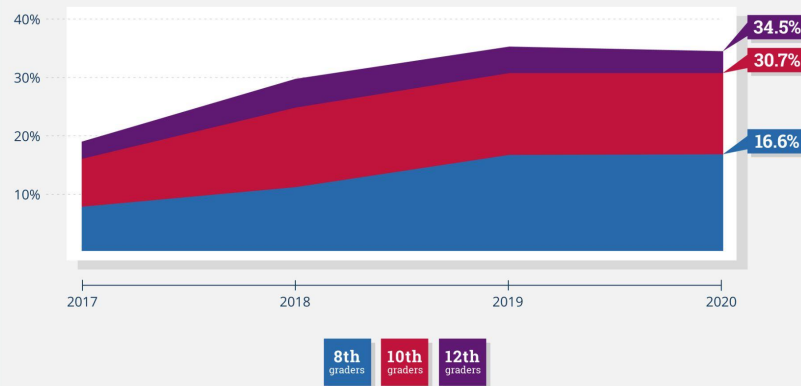

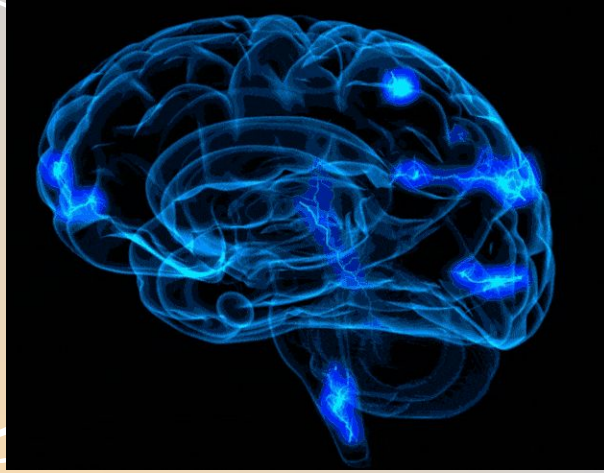
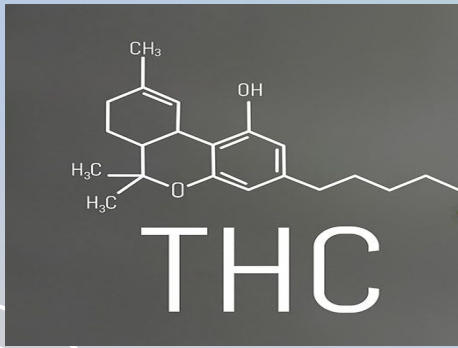
### Past-Year Nicotine Vaping Held Steady



# What's in them?



- This is what is more commonly known as marijuana.
- THC is delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol and is a naturally occurring psychoactive chemical in marijuana. It is what makes users feel high.
- THC works by attaching to the body's cannabinoid receptors, which are found throughout the brain and concentrated in areas of the brain associated with pleasure, memory, concentration, coordination and sensory and time perception.
- THC overloads these receptors and disrupts the communication between neurons in these parts of the brain.



- THC causes the brain to release excess amounts of dopamine, creating the euphoric high.
- Long term effects of THC can be unpredictable but, as the brain is still developing until around the age of 25, use of marijuana by adolescents can have a negative impact on learning, memory and long term mental health.



# *Not your grandfather's marijuana*

The amount of THC in marijuana products has been steadily increasing since the mid 1990's

- In 1995, marijuana seized by the DEA contained an average of approximately 4% THC
- In 2019, the average was over 14% for “flower” or “bud” marijuana
- THC concentrates in the form of Dabs, Waxes and Oils can contain anywhere from 70% to 90%+ THC





# *How is it used? THC and Dab Pens*



**Dabs/Waxes**

A small amount of the THC Concentrate (aka wax) is placed into the bowl and then heated



**THC Pens**

These can look similar to nicotine vapes but the cartridge contains THC Concentrate/Oil



*Dab pen located by a local company that contracts to provide drug detecting dogs to schools. The knife was used for scooping the wax into the device*

# CBD

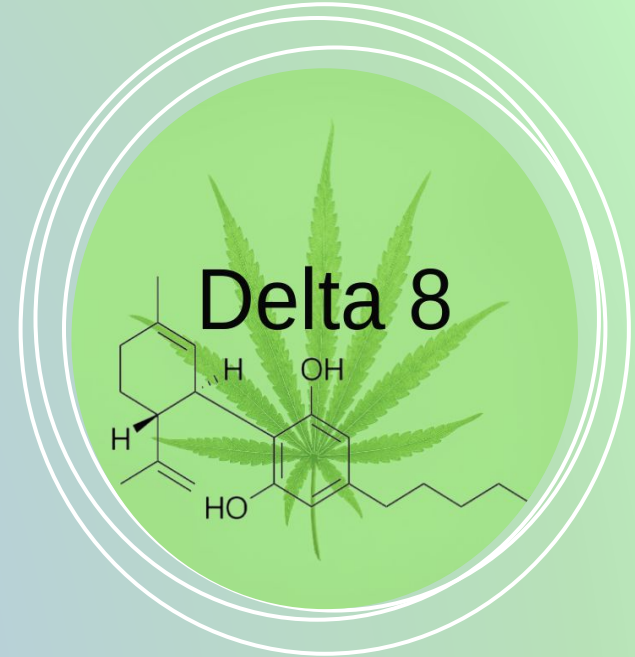
- Cannabidiol is the 2nd most prevalent ingredient in marijuana.
- It is derived from the hemp plant.
- Some derivatives contain no THC.
- In Texas, CBD may contain up to .03% THC.
- It is approved for use for patients with certain seizure disorders
- Many report that it helps with anxiety, insomnia, and chronic pain.
- It's estimated that 14% of adults use CBD
- It does not produce a marijuana-like high and is not as popular with young people.





# *Delta 8 - THC*

- Delta-8 is similar to Delta-9 THC (the commonly used THC)
- It is derived from the hemp plant.
- The CBD is extracted and processed in a lab to create Delta 8.
- When ingested, it creates a high similar to traditional marijuana but is less potent.
- It will cause an individual to test positive for marijuana in a drug test
- It is not currently regulated so there is no oversight or regulations on the processes used to create it.
- It's legal status is in question.

# What is an opioid?



Opioids are a substance used to treat pain.

They bind to the opioid receptors in the brain.

They can be natural, synthetic, or semi-synthetic.

# What is fentanyl?

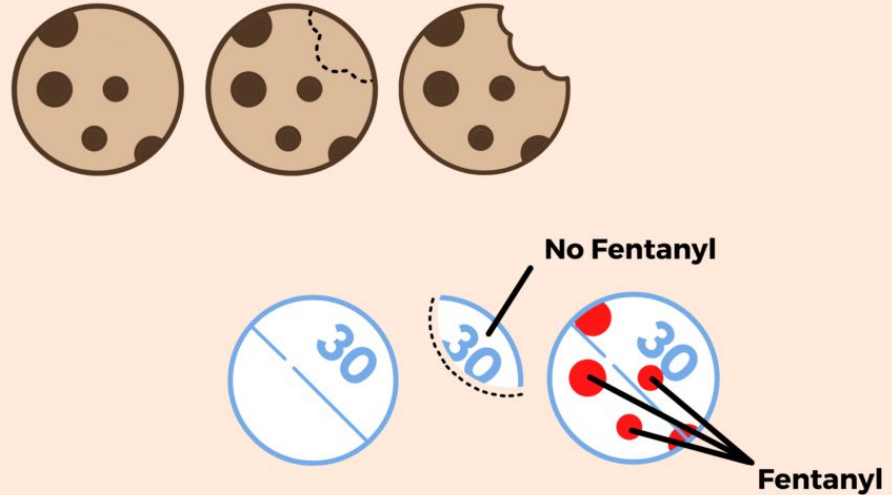


- Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid.
- It is 100 times more potent than morphine and 50 times more potent than heroin.
- It is used by doctors to treat severe and chronic pain experienced mostly by cancer patients.
- Illegally manufactured fentanyl is responsible for the increase in overdose deaths.

# Why is it so dangerous?

- Fentanyl can be mixed with other substances, but it won't be equally blended.
- This is known as chocolate chipping.
- One dose may contain a deadly amount of fentanyl, while the other does not produce an effect.

# *Marketing and Pop Culture*

- In 2019 , 73% of the top 15 most popular programs with 15- to 24-year-olds feature characters who smoke or depict tobacco products, exposing more than 27 million young people to tobacco.
- A study published in JAMA in 2018 investigated the prevalence of combustible and electronic tobacco and marijuana products in hip-hop music. The researchers covered the period from 2013 to 2017 and focused on videos of the top 50 songs from Billboard magazine's Hot R&B/Hip-Hop songs.
- In 2015, they discovered that over 40% of these videos featured the use of cannabis. This was either through electronic or combustible use or smoke and vapor.
- The percentage increased to almost 51% by 2016



# *Social Media and Substance Use*



- Teens on social media are constantly exposed to peers, celebrities and influencers engaging in and glorifying substance use.
- A study conducted by the National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University found that teenagers who regularly use popular social media outlets were more likely to drink, use drugs, and buy tobacco than adolescents who either did not use social media or used it less frequently.
- Researchers found that, compared to nonusers or infrequent users of social media, this group was:
  - 5 times more likely to buy cigarettes.
  - 3 times more likely to drink.
  - 2 times as likely to use marijuana.

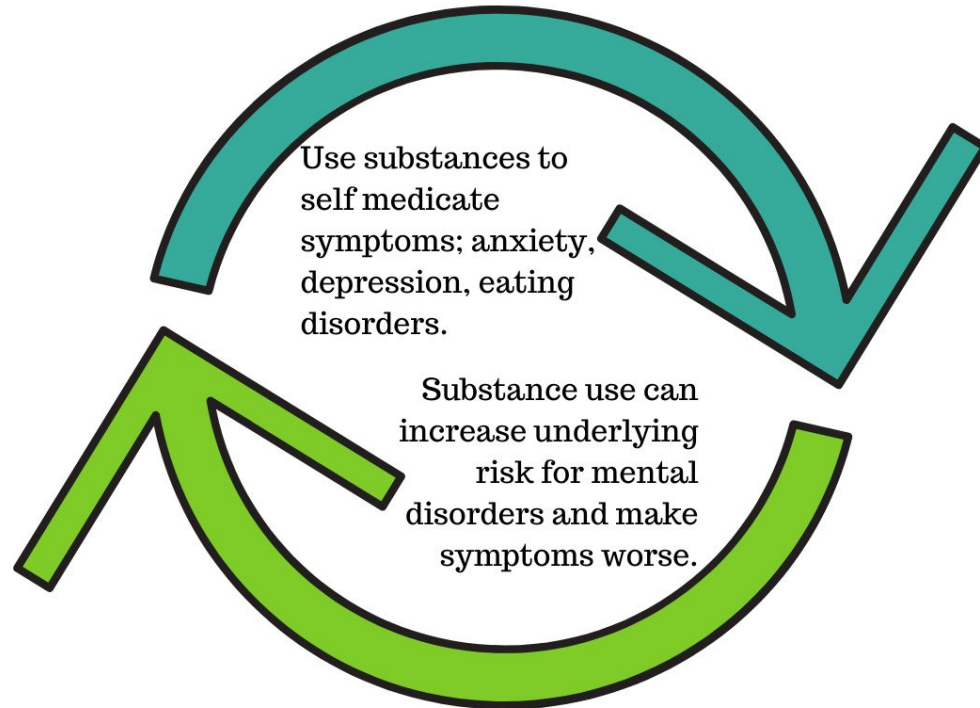

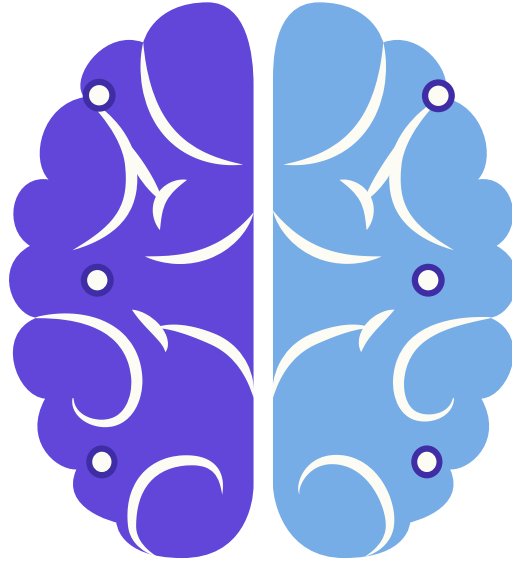

# Indicators of Substance Abuse

## Psychological Changes

- Frequent mood swings or emotional instability.
- Extreme highs and lows.
- Manipulative or deceitful behavior.
- Decreased motivation.
- Lethargy or low energy.
- Memory problems.
- Poor concentration.

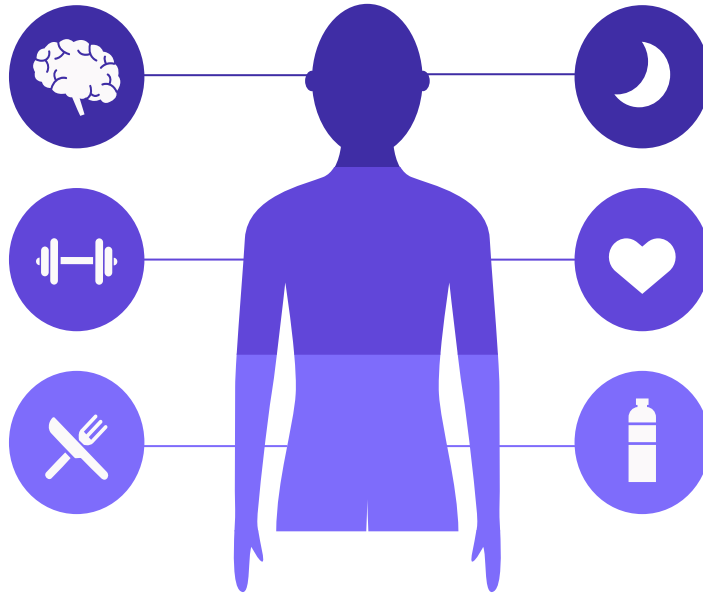


- Slurred or rapid-fire speech.
- Laughing for no apparent reason.
- Being unusually loud and obnoxious.
- Being fearful or paranoid for no apparent reason.
- Periods of drowsiness followed by periods of high energy.
- Other unexplained changes in attitude or personality.

# Indicators of Substance Abuse

## Health Problems

- Appetite changes.
- Sleep disturbances.
- Excessive thirst (known as cottonmouth and typically occurs as a result of marijuana use).
- Nausea and vomiting.
- Sweating.
- Headaches.
- Frequent illness.
- Sudden weight loss or gain.



- Coordination problems.
- Nosebleeds (may occur due to the snorting of drugs such as cocaine).
- Constipation.
- Seizures (without a history of epilepsy or other seizure disorder).
- Runny nose.
- Shakes or tremors.
- Accidents or injuries.



# Indicators of Substance Abuse

## Personal Appearance

- Poor hygiene.
- Poor coordination.
- Teeth clenching.
- Bloodshot eyes.
- Bruises, cuts, and sores (from falling, bumping into things, or scratching oneself).
- Constant scratching (a common sign of opiate use).



- Track marks on arms or legs from intravenous drug use.
- Wearing long sleeves even in the summer (to cover up track marks).
- Burns on fingers or lips (from joints).
- Pinpoint pupils (a common sign of opiate use).
- Smelling like drugs, alcohol, or other unusual odor.

# Indicators of Substance Abuse

## Other Signs

Finding drug paraphernalia

Finding drug residue or remains

Smelling strong incense or perfumes within your teenager's personal space



Missing medications, alcohol, cigarettes, etc.

Missing cash or other resources

Finding hidden stashes of drugs or alcohol.
