

# DRESS CODE

## 2024-25

**VISIBLE  
ID FOR  
GRADES 6-12  
REQUIRED!**

Dress code requirements will be enforced beginning on the first day of school.

### TOPS

Button-downs, Polos, T-shirts, Blouses, Sweaters, Vests, Sweatshirts, and Coats

*Hooded clothing is allowed with hood removed from head.*

- o No sleeveless, backless, halter tops, tank tops, tube tops, crop tops or spaghetti straps.
- o No muscle shirts or shirts with large armholes.
- o No shirts that show any midriff or cleavage.
- o No wording or graphics that promote violence, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, firearms, or gang affiliation or is obscene, crude, vulgar, or defamatory or that cause a disruption of the educational setting.

### MISCELLANEOUS

- o Clothing allowed in all colors, patterns, stripes, etc. as well as fabrics including cotton, denim, silk, flannel, linen, etc.
- o No hoodies or head coverings in buildings including caps/visors, berets, head scarfs (unless for documented medical or religious reasons, hoods (hoodies), Du rags, sweatbands, or kerchiefs.
- o No rips or tears that expose skin or undergarments (patches allowed).
- o No underwear or undergarments may be exposed and/or visible at any time. However, sufficient/appropriate underclothing is required.
- o Clothing items cannot be worn in any way that reflects gang affiliation, conceals contraband, or creates a distraction.
- o No costumes or trench coats/dusters
- o No one-piece jumpsuits (secondary students).

#### Grooming/Jewelry

- o Dress or grooming that presents a disruption, health, or safety hazard to the students or others is expressly prohibited.
- o Students' hair, including facial hair, shall be clean, neatly cut, and combed so as to be kept out of the eyes.
- o Tattoos that are obscene, crude, defamatory, vulgar, or related to gang/criminal activity shall be covered while at any school activity.

### BOTTOMS

Pants/J Jeans, Shorts, Skirts, Skorts, and Jumpers

- o No pants of any kind with holes or frayed material that reveals any area of skin or undergarments.
- o Absolutely no underwear or undergarments may be exposed (no pants below the hips).
- o No pajamas or sleepwear; coveralls; strapless or spaghetti strap dresses; or sliding/biking/compression shorts as outerwear.
- o May not be shorter than fingertip length; skirt slits no higher than mid-thigh.
- o No overalls for secondary students (except Senior days).

### SHOES

- o No house shoes or slippers, metal cleats, or shoes with wheels.

### BACKPACKS

- o Clear backpacks are required for secondary students (Gr. 6-12); must be clear plastic, not tinted or full mesh (some mesh on water bottle holder allowed); Straps can be solid colored.
- o Clear backpacks are preferred for elementary students (Gr. PreK-5).
- o Students may have a small clutch purse (4.5x6.5) with or without a handle or strap.
- o Bags for school activities (fine arts, athletics) should be stored in the activity area or designated campus area outside of the main building.

## Bring Your Device

ROISD established 1-to-1 take-home devices for all secondary students so that students would have access for educational use. Devices use the district Wi-Fi access and students must follow all ROISD Internet Safety and Acceptable Use policies and guidelines. Access to district technology resources is a privilege and may be revoked for use violations. Device protection insurance is recommended for families to purchase to cover damage or other issues.

# K-12 IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS AT A GLANCE

All immunizations must be current in order for students to register and pick up school schedules, and all immunization records must be validated by a health care provider signature or a clinic stamp. A TB skin test may be required. Foreign vaccination records (except Mexico) must be translated by International Language Services, 501 Elm St., Dallas, TX 75202, 972-783-2500. A copy of the translated record must be returned to the school before enrolling.


## VACCINE REQUIRED DOSES

DTaP/DTP/DT/Tdap	5 doses with one received after the 4th birthday; or 4 doses if 4th dose was given on or after the 4th birthday. 7th grade: booster of Tdap if at least 5 years since the last tetanus containing vaccine. 8th-12th grade: Tdap required when 10 years have passed since last tetanus containing vaccine.
POLIO	4 doses with one received after the 4th birthday or 3 doses if 3rd dose was given on or after the 4th birthday.
MMR	2 doses with 1st dose received after 1st birthday.
HEPATITIS B	3 doses, given at any time after birth. "At Birth" for the 1st dose is not acceptable. A date must be provided with a health care provider signature or clinic stamp.
VARICELLA	If no history of the disease: Kindergarten-12th grade: 2 doses required. 1st dose must be on or after 1st birthday.
HEPATITIS A	Kindergarten-12th grade: 2 doses required. 1st dose must be on or after 1st birthday.
Meningococcal	7th - 12th grade: 1 dose quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate vaccine required on or after student's 11th birthday.

# Hearty Hawks

## Now Eating Breakfast and Lunch for FREE!



Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, all Red Oak ISD students can receive **FREE** breakfast and lunch meals through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), a national program for schools in qualifying areas. The program also eliminates the collection of meal applications which reduces burdens for both families and school administrators and helps ensure that students receive nutritious meals.

The program will allow **ALL Red Oak ISD students** to choose an entrée, grain, veggie, fruit, and milk for meals at breakfast and lunch. The program does not cover additional items including, but not limited to, second entrees or meal items, ala carte, snacks, etc. Families can still use SchoolCafe for accounts if they wish to purchase items outside the CEP meal.

Red Oak ISD must still collect and report the socioeconomic status of each student via a socioeconomic information form (SIF) which has been added to the enrollment and registration packet. Parents/caregivers may be asked to resubmit the form if the information was not completed during enrollment. Changes to the SIF may be submitted through a paper form at your student's campus.

The information collected is sent to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) to ensure campuses receive federal and state funds appropriately and to ensure campuses are compared to similar campuses.



# Here We Grow

Second Middle School:  
Progress to Ease Overcrowding

**In May 2023**, ROISD voters approved by election a bond for up to \$97.5 million for a second middle school. The construction began earlier this year on land the District owned in Ovilla off Westmoreland Road. The second school will alleviate crowding at the current middle school, which is well over capacity, and provide room to grow for many years to come.

As of the end of June, the piers for the foundation are projected to be 100% completed; concrete parking lots, fire lanes, and driveways are being poured; and the slab pours will begin over the summer break. Steel is being delivered and the vertical construction of the building should begin by mid-July. Sewer and water utilities for the facility have been completed to be tied into the building when complete.

**Behind the scenes**, District staff is continuing the timelines for technology infrastructure, design elements, and furniture, fixtures and equipment.

This fall, the District will begin the facility naming and rezoning process. Both will include community input windows and opportunities for public comment, along with demographic data and enrollment projections from the demographer.

The project completion date is late fall of 2025, a slight delay which will require some special arrangements to start the school year. Fall of 2025 will have two campuses functioning at the existing Red Oak Middle School facility. The Texas Education Agency will only allow a new school with a unique ID number to come online in the fall at the start of school, regardless of the facility. Both campuses will have their own principal, assigned staff, zoned students, and schedules.

When the facility is ready to move in – likely over winter break – the students and staff assigned to the new school will transition over and have the spring semester in the new

facility. We are gathering processes from other schools that have had such a structure and know our Hawk families will be flexible during this transition.

“We continue to monitor every penny spent on the new school and review timelines to come in under budget,” added Superintendent Sanford. “We take seriously the trust given to us and will uphold our fiscal responsibilities and moral obligations to our taxpayers and the community.”

A second middle school will create two smaller learning environments that provide more enrichment opportunities. It also increases safety at both schools and improves staff/student relationships which promotes academics and attendance and reduces discipline. <<<

# MARQUEE PROGRAMS

## in Red Oak ISD



### **CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE)**

Students interested in CTE classes can select a pathway toward an industry-based certification along with high school and collegiate credit through dual credit classes. Red Oak High School (ROHS) offers over 15 CTE pathways with almost 90 courses, and 40 industry certifications for students to begin their careers after graduation.



### **HAWK SCHOLARS ACADEMY – ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM**

Select ROHS students may earn up 48-60 credit hours towards an associate degree via dual credit coursework. The agreement allows ROHS students to graduate from high school as well as earn an associate degree (60 hours). The Navarro College degree is accepted intact by the University of Texas at Arlington, allowing students to begin at UTA with junior-level classes. Best of all, these students remain part of the ROHS campus and enjoy extracurriculars.



### **TEXAS STATE TECHNICAL COLLEGE (TSTC North Texas)**

A top-notch technical education college is located just behind Red Oak High School. Students benefit from the convenience of TSTC North Texas and earn dual credit towards certificates and associate degrees. All current ROHS students enjoy 50% off of tuition.



### **PROJECT LEAD THE WAY (PLTW) ENGINEERING AT ROHS**

The Red Oak ISD Education Foundation and ROHS were awarded a \$35,000 engineering grant through Project Lead the Way (PLTW), which is the nation's leading provider in STEM programs (science, technology, engineering and math). PLTW will enhance the already thriving engineering, CAD and robotics programs at ROHS.



### **ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES**

Red Oak High School has been nationally recognized by the Advanced Placement (AP) College Board. AP courses are designed to prepare students for college-level academics. At the conclusion of the course, students are encouraged to take an AP Exam. Scoring well on that exam can earn college credits, saving time and money toward collegiate degrees.



### **DUAL CREDIT COURSES**

Red Oak High School is the top provider of dual credit opportunities in Ellis County. ROHS offers dual credit coursework in academics and career & technical education. In addition to Navarro College, ROHS partners with the University of Texas at Arlington and Texas State Technical College to offer classes to students.



### **NAVY JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING CORPS (NJROTC) AT ROHS**

Founded in 2009, the NJROTC at ROHS continues to be a successful program and yields numerous military scholarships for students. Our award-winning cadets participate in drill, color guard, academics, orienteering and air rifle competitions.
